Coimbatore: The Centre for Environmental Studies, Amrita Vishwa Vidyapeetham University, and the Centre for Healing Across Cultures, Cleveland State University, Ohio, the U.S., signed a Memorandum of Understanding for promoting academic master rolls. for use research in traditional medicine, here on Monday.


